We are grateful to the SEBC for the foundation they have laid and are honored to continue to promote our language, our culture. Esther will continue her efforts as a director of the PSLA board.

SEBC is committed to maintain support for PSLA students of Spanish descent.

As of June 13th 2015, PSLA will assume all duties and responsibilities for the Spanish School.

PSLA Spanish School

The PSLA Board of Directors will carry out the vision of the parents and legal guardians of the students. All parents / legal guardians become members of the PSLA upon enrollment.

PSLA Spanish School will offer Spanish language classes on Saturday mornings at 3250 Commercial Drive, Vancouver (Croatian Cultural Center). The school year will be organized in three trimesters (Fall, Winter and Spring), with 10 classes per session. We will follow the Vancouver School Board calendar and break for Christmas, Spring Break, and holidays throughout the year.

How much will the classes cost?

PSLA has made concerted efforts to maintain the lowest costs possible for all our families. Due to a lack of funding, there will be a small increase in tuition as of the 2015-2016 school year. The cost per session is \$125. Please note, all books and supplies will be included in the tuition fee and no longer require a separate payment. To cover our administration costs, a non-refundable annual registration fee of \$25 will apply per family.

We have a solid pool of qualified, native Spanish-speaking teaching staff at our Spanish school. Our teachers are committed to excellence and offer a progressive curriculum to engage and enrich students of all levels, providing an exceptional and solid learning experience.
